

Disarmament, Demobilization, and Reintegration of Ex-Combatants

Description

Episode 101 examines the disarmament, demobilization, and reintegration (DDR) of ex-combatants.

Our guests begin by introducing the concept of DDR and discussing how the DDR process plays a role in preventing the recurrence of conflict. They then discuss some common challenges of implementing and monitoring DDR efforts, providing some real-world examples of ongoing and recent DDR efforts in Colombia, El Salvador, Mexico, and Niger. They also discuss roles for military organizations in DDR efforts before closing with policy implications of their research and field work.

She also holds positions as a UK Research and Innovation Future Leaders Fellow at the Latin America and Caribbean Centre of the London School of Economics and as a Scholar in Residence at George Mason University. Dr. McPhee consults regularly for the International Organization for Migration and UN Organization for Migration. She was also previously the Deputy Director of the Irregular Warfare Initiative Fellows Program. She holds a doctorate in Human Development from The University of Chicago, and an MBA from Simmons University in Boston.
